

# Paul Teichert is Crossings champ

Paul Teichert has been in contention for the men's match play championship at The Crossings the past two years. On Sunday, he captured his first club championship, beating former champion Jim Hagen 3-and-1 in the nine-hole title match.

Teichert's path to the championship match included wins over Darwin Strand, Doug Strei and last year's champion, Jason Rongstad.

Hagen, who won this tournament in 1982 before moving to California, scored wins over Matt Sather, Vern Teichert and Tyler Sachariason.

In the championship match on the back nine, both players parred the 10th, bogeyed the 11th, and parred the 12th holes.

Teichert took a 1-up lead with a par on the 13th hole, and he extended his lead to two holes by knocking in a short birdie putt on the

14th. Hagen, who was the medalist in Saturday's qualifying round with an even-par 72, got one back by getting up and down for a par on the 14th.

Teichert chipped to within inches of the cup on the 15th to get a hole-winning par and take a 2-up lead with two holes remaining.

Both players were in trouble off the tee on the short, par-4 17th, but Teichert chipped in from the back edge of the green for the win.

"I got off the tee pretty well," said Teichert, who was runner-up to Kevin McFarland two years ago and lost to McFarland in the semifinals last year. "My chipping was good, but I can't say my putting was great."

Hagen said the best part of his game Sunday was his iron play. "In the early matches, I hit four or five irons 'gimme' distance," he said.

# Spartans play .500 ball in region tourney

After keeping their state tournament hopes alive with a win over Canby, the Montevideo Spartans were eliminated from the Region 9C baseball tournament by Dumont on Saturday at Wheaton.

Ada and Dumont will represent Region 9C in the state Class C amateur tournament.

### Montevideo 7, Canby 6

The Spartans stayed alive in the tournament with a 7-6 win over a Knights team that they had lost to 14-4 in the final game of the regular season.

Joe Schlagel's two-run single helped the Spartans take a 3-0 lead in the first inning.

After Canby scored four times in the bottom of the inning, the Spartans scored single runs in the second, third and fourth innings.

Mitch Christensen doubled and scored on Troy Hendrickson's single in the second; Cam Vien doubled and scored on a groundout by Tyler Kuno in the third; and Colton Vien doubled to

Catcher Tim Epema threw out two Canby baserunners to snuff out a potential Knights rally in the sixth.

Cam Vien's solo homer in the seventh gave Montevideo a 7-5 lead.

Canby got a run back in the eighth, but Christensen, on in relief of Colton Vien, struck out the final batter with the bases loaded in the ninth.

Dumont pounded out 13 hits and capitalized on six Montevideo errors to eliminate the Spartans from the tournament in seven innings.

The Spartans finished the season with a record of 12-13 and were a much-improved team in their second season, according to manager Brandon Raymo.

"For being our second year and still a fairly young ball team, we sure put a nice run together to end the season. It is pretty rare in amateur ball to see a young team do as well as we did. It usu-

ally takes four to five years to build a program, but through hard work and dedication from a good group of guys, we have accomplished to build a fairly successful program in two years. Next year we will have one more year under our belt, and we will be even better."

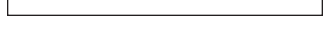
We have several patients who complain of snoring and sleep apnea but more often than not, it is the spouse that complains of the noise and movement.
